Dr. Leichman's research focuses on pediatric sleep in young children and their families, publishing in such journals as Sleep Medicine, Journal of Sleep Research, and Journal of Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology. Dr. Leichman is a licensed psychologist and Nationally Certified School Psychologist with specialized training in behavioral sleep medicine. Dr. Leichman received her doctorate from Lehigh University, completing her internship at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center and postdoctoral clinical training at The Kennedy Krieger Institute at The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. She also trained at the Sleep Center at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.
